Medical

There have been a number of cases of Threadworms within the School. This is a highly contagious condition. Please see the information below from the NHS website. We would appreciate parents' collaboration with reinforcing good personal hygiene which is proven to significantly reduce the risk of spreading.

Threadworms (pinworms) are tiny worms in faeces. They're common in children and spread easily. You can treat them without seeing your GP. You can buy medicine for threadworms from pharmacies. This is usually a chewable tablet or liquid you swallow. Treat everyone in your household, even if they do not have symptoms.

Symptoms can include: extreme itching around the anus, particularly at night and irritability, waking up during the night and possibly bed wetting.

Online Safety

We would like to remind parents that we do not allow pupils to bring mobile phones, tablets or cameras into the school as they can distract pupils from their learning and damage children's privacy.

If, in exceptional circumstances, a child needs to bring a phone into school they must hand the phone to the school office for safekeeping during the school day. The school may impose sanctions on pupils who break these rules.

Parents will also want to help ensure that their children are safe when using their phone or tablet at home, and will want to know about what they are sharing online. Any Social Media site used by children will have inherent risks; the website net-aware.org.uk provides advice on many popular sites along with a suggested minimum age.

If our pupils see unpleasant or hurtful comments they have been taught to take a screenshot and show a trusted adult. We will treat cyberbullying seriously and may impose sanctions on pupils.

Packed Lunches

In order to ensure that packed lunches are suitably healthy and meet the guidelines set by Durham County Council, parents are reminded that they **should not contain** any of the following:

- Fizzy / sugary drinks in cartons, bottles or cans
- Chocolate-coated products / sweets / confectionary
- Chocolate spread as a filling for sandwiches
- Chewing gum
- Sugared / toffee and salted popcorn

Please also remember that we are a nut-free school- your supporting in keeping all children safe is appreciated.

Y6 Wildlife Awareness

Graham Temby visited Y6 this Monday to talk to us about Wildlife Awareness. We learned about badgers: where they live; what they like to eat; their territories and their special features. Sadly, up to 50,000 badgers are killed on our roads every year! Graham asked the children to remind adults to take care and slow down when driving along country roads, especially at night. We were also shocked to learn that some people still hunt badgers to hurt them. Badger baiting is a horrible crime that still happens in our area. People also set up snares and traps which can injure or kill badgers or other wildlife. Help FOSS raise money every time you buy on Amazon

For those of you who aren't aware when you go to the FOSS website http://www.shincliffe-foss.org.uk you will see a big Amazon logo

When you click on the logo, you will be taken to Amazon as usual, where you can browse and purchase just as you normally would.

It costs you nothing extra. Amazon then sends FOSS a percentage of the purchase price. It's that simple! The rate varies by product category and number of items purchased in a given month, but it's typically 5% or more of the purchase price. Even small purchases can help push us into a higher rate tier and thereby earn us more on all purchases.

You can easily add the link to your home screen on your mobile device so you never forget

Quick instructions to add to home screen

Android devices

Launch Chrome for Android and open the FOSS website www.shincliffe-foss.org.uk. Tap the menu button and tap Add to home screen.

You'll be able to enter a name for the shortcut and then Chrome will add it to your home screen.

The icon will appear on your home screen like any other app shortcut

iPhone, iPad

Launch the Safari browser on Apple's iOS and navigate to the website or web page you want to add to your home screen. Tap the Share button on the browser's toolbar — that's the rectangle with an arrow pointing upward. It's on the bar at the top of the screen on an iPad, and on the bar at the bottom of the screen on an iPhone or iPod Touch. Tap the Add to Home Screen icon in the Share menu. You'll be prompted to name the shortcut before tapping the Add button
