### **Parking**

For safety reasons, please do not park directly in front of the school gates at any time. Please drive with extreme caution and care if you do need to access Beal Walk. Beal Walk and surrounding roads do not have pavements and are often used by our children, so it is dangerous to drive whilst people are walking to and from school.

#### **School Extra-Curricular Activities**

This week you will have received notification of the range of extra-curricular activities we are able to offer during the first half of the Autumn Term. If you haven't already done so, please express you interest using the booking form provided.

Where it is necessary to cancel a club- for example due to poor weather conditions we will aim to do so before 10am on the morning of the club in order to allow parents as much time as possible to make necessary pick up arrangements. When a club is cancelled it is not possible to provide an alternative activity. This is because all of our clubs are led by specialist leaders and coaches in their field and they are not able to provide alternative activities. This is in line with our rationale for after school clubsnamely that they provide enrichment activities to support the delivery of the curriculum and personal development of the children, rather than simply offering childcare.

#### Medical
