Traffic in the Vicinity of the School

As you will be aware, we work in partnership with the Parish Council and Durham Police to address issues of parking and access to the school by car. Durham Police conducted a 'Speedwatch Survey' on Tues 22nd January between 8.45 and 9.15am along the perimeter road around the estate in order to get some statistics regarding speeding. Of the 58 cars measured ALL exceeded the current 30mph limit with some traveling at speeds of 45 mph. Many of the cars were carrying children. I ask all parents to consider the safety of our children and drive responsibly when using the roads within Shincliffe. This is in order to ensure the safety of all of our children.

Recycle Inkjet Cartridges



Recycle your empty inkjet cartridges to help protect the environment and raise money for Shincliffe Primary School.

Just put your empty HP, Dell, Lexmark, Canon, Samsung, Neopost ink jet cartridges in the attached prepaid envelope and pop in the post.

Recycling Criteria

Makes you can recycle include HP, Dell, Lexmark, Canon, Samsung, Neopost.

Only these virgin cartridges will raise money for charity when recycled. All inkjet cartridges must pass a visual inspection & electrical test. "Virgin Cartridges" mean cartridges which have not been refilled before and carry only the original equipment manufacturers branding.

Please do not send Epson or Kodak cartridges

<u>Laser & Toner cartridges are not accepted</u> through this recycling service.

Cartridges don't have donation value if:

- Damaged
- They have been previously refilled
- They have been labelled for another brand like Tesco, PC World
- They have labels removed or extra holes. (Signs that refilling has been attempted)
