Friends of Shincliffe School (FOSS)

Who are we?

FOSS is another name for the <u>school's community association</u>. We are a small group of volunteers made up of parents, carers and members of our local community. We work in partnership with the teachers to help develop the school and the activities on offer so the pupils have the best experience possible while they are with us.

What do we do?

FOSS supports the school by putting on <u>fun events</u> for the children, their families and our local community by maximising the range of activities the school is able to offer.

The Christmas and Summer fairs are always popular with the whole family while the discos and magic shows are great social events for the kids.

In the last two years prior to Covid, FOSS has raised on average £8,000 per year. The fundraising we are able to do through our events supports school trips for all classes, theatre productions, books for the library and outdoor play equipment among many other things.

Our next big project

Our next big project is developing the school site by providing raised flower beds for each class so the children can grow their own plants and food as this closely links with the school's sustainability and green community development plan. After a year of very limited fundraising due to Covid we really **need to focus our efforts this year** so we can get the flower beds installed as soon as possible.

FOSS is run by a warm and welcoming team of volunteer parents and carers... BUT we are very small....

We welcome all support and are particularly grateful for help running events, no matter how much or little time you can spare. Covid-19 Step 4 Guidance - Key messages

COVID-19 guidance

As part of the *Step 4 Guidance for Schools*, from Monday 16th August unvaccinated young people up to the age of 18 years and 6 months and fully vaccinated adults, are no longer required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19. If you haven't already been vaccinated then you can book online https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/

Those identified as a close contact will be informed by NHS Test and Trace that they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. We strongly encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so. <u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing/get-tested-for-coronavirus/</u>

Pupils who are experiencing coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, will not attend the school and are advised to self-isolate and arrange a PCR test where symptoms are presented.

Primary age pupils **will not be** tested with LFDs. PHE have advised there are currently limited public health benefits attached to testing primary pupils with lateral flow devices. Staff in primary schools,

will continue to test themselves using LFD twice a week at home until the end of September, when this will be reviewed.

Although social distancing is no longer a legal requirement for staff and pupils, we still have a legal duty to ensure the health and safety of staff and pupils and measures previously put in place (e.g., one-way systems/dedicated access/egress points into the building) to ease congestion when staff and pupils are entering/exiting and moving about the building will continue. The government has removed the requirement to wear face coverings in law, but it is recommended that face coverings are worn in crowded and enclosed spaces where you come into contact with people you don't normally meet and therefore we ask that you follow, where possible, this recommendation when dropping off and picking up your children.

School will continue to ensure good hygiene for everyone, maintain appropriate cleaning regimes, keep occupied spaces well ventilated, and follow public health advice on testing and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19. Handwashing and application of hand sanitiser will be part of the daily routines in school.

Safeguarding- information for parents

Definition of Safeguarding This can be summarised as:

o Protecting children from maltreatment

o Preventing impairment of children's health or development

o Ensuring that children are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care

Safeguarding is not just about protecting children from deliberate harm. It relates to aspects of school life including:

- o Pupils' health and safety
- o Meeting the needs of pupils with medical conditions
- o Providing first aid
- o Educational visits
- o Internet or e-safety
- o Appropriate arrangements to ensure school security

Safeguarding can involve a range of potential issues such as:

- o cyberbullying (by text message, on social networking sites, and so on)
- o Racist, disability, and homophobic or transphobic abuse
- o Radicalisation and extremist behaviour
- o Child sexual exploitation
- o Sexting
- o Substance misuse
- o Peer on Peer abuse
- o Sexual harassment and sexual violence

o Issues that may be specific to a local area or population, for example gang activity and youth violence

o Particular issues affecting children including domestic violence, sexual exploitation, female genital mutilation and forced marriage

Our Safeguarding Policy is available on the school website. *Training*

2 members of staff are currently trained in Level 2 safeguarding and child protection: Mr P Rumbles (Headteacher)

Mrs H Armstrong (Year 2 teacher)

All other staff and governors have been trained in Level 1 safeguarding and child protection. Mr Rumbles and Mrs Armstrong regularly access additional training, for example in Female Genital Mutilation, Prevent, Online Safety, Child Sexual Exploitation, Sexual Harassment and Sexual Violence and Domestic Violence.

Online Safety Information

There are many positives associated with the Internet and children are increasingly using the Internet for both education and play. As a school, we believe that online safety education is a crucial element of the curriculum and an essential part of young people's development. To raise awareness of the issues that children and young people face online today, the school carries out many age appropriate activities, including participating in the 'Safer Internet Day' organised by the UK Safer Internet Centre as well as half termly e-safety lessons. The UK Safer Internet Centre website contains information which is very useful for parents to support the work done in school and ensure that our children keep safe whilst using the ever-expanding growth of mobile technology.

The online safety section of our school website will provide you with links to really useful advice on how children can safely use the Internet together with some great tips on how to keep safe.

Current Year 6 Pupils procedure to apply for a Secondary School in 2022

The application process for the Secondary Admissions 2021 Intake began on **Monday 6th September 2021**. Parents can make their application for Secondary School online by visiting www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions and the School Admissions online application facility will be available to parents from **Monday the 6th of September 2021**. The Closing Date for Secondary School Applications is the 31st October 2021. If parents do not wish to apply online they can complete a paper application form, and these are available to print from our website (same website address as above) from Monday the 6th September 2020. Alternatively these application forms can be requested by email to schooladmissions@durham.gov.uk or by telephone from the School Admissions and Transport Team on 03000 265896. Copies of the Parent's guide **"Primary and Secondary School Admissions in County Durham 2021/2022"** will also be available from our website or on request from Monday the 6th September 2021. **www.durham.gov.uk**

School Admissions 2022 – Will your child turn 5 between September 2022 and 31st August 2023?

If so, you need to complete an application online to tell Durham County Council which school you would like your child to attend from September 2022. Visit <u>www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u> where you can access a useful guide to help with your application. We encourage you to apply online wherever possible as although restrictions have been lifted, staff will be in the main working from home due to the Coronavirus pandemic. If you are unable to apply online, paper application forms and available on request.

You still need to apply even if your child attends the nursery unit attached to the school, or already has a sibling at the school. Applications open 6 September and close midnight 15 January 2022.
