Resources on the <u>NSPCC website</u>, gives parents all the tools they need to have regular and informed conversations with their child about staying safe online. Under 20% of parents <u>discuss online safety</u> regularly with their children but we want to get every family talking about their child's life online, just as they would their day at school. Parents can also get advice on <u>online wellbeing</u> and how to set up <u>parental controls</u>.
