Y4 Educational Trip to Vindolanda

On Tuesday, Year 4 visited the Roman fort at Vindolanda in Northumberland. When we arrived, an archaeologist who told us all about the site met us. He said if we dropped hats or gloves into the soil there, they could be preserved for thousands of years. He also told us about the hundreds of Roman shoes he had found. We enjoyed learning about life on the fort and seeing the buildings that were once there.

We then went to the Roman Army Museum and we found out how to greet people in Latin (Salve) and how to count to three. We learnt about what life at Vindolanda would have been like for the Roman soldiers from watching the 3D film.

I have set you an example that you should do as I have done.'
