Headteacher's Message

We have had a busy week in school this week. All our children enjoyed a 'Rocksteady' Music assembly where they got to sing, play instruments and take part in workshops. Y5 and Y6 children have also taken part in a Quidditch day in partnership with the School Sports team. As well as this, our Reception class went on an educational visit to Hardwick Park. All of these opportunities help to enhance and enrich the learning experiences of our children in school. It was an absolute pleasure for Mrs Silvester and I to see the Reception children all enjoying themselves and taking part in all of the different activities with such enthusiasm and interest. They all behaved so well and they were a real credit to our school whilst we were there.
