## What have we been learning?

- We have been reading the story of "**The Night Pirates**" & we really enjoyed hearing that it was the "rough, tough little girl pirates" who outwitted the grown up pirates!
- In our Phonics sessions this week we have been beginning to read words with five sounds (twist, trust, crunch) and we are also working hard to recognise our new "tricky words" onsight.
- In Maths we have been learning to write the number 13 correctly with the help of "**Episode 13**" from the "Tia Ten Show" on Ten Town. We have also been learning that the number 13 is made up of 10 and 3 more (Tia Ten and Thelma Three) not a 1 & a 3, because that would be 4 not 13.
- We have absolutely loved learning all about pirate ships this week & naming the different parts of them. (e.g. Crow's Nest, rigging, anchor, deck etc).

It was great fun (but rather messy!) using pastels to do an observational drawing of a pirate ship.
