Modern Foreign Languages

At Shincliffe we teach French from Reception to Year 6. Our aim is to foster pupils' curiosity and deepen their understanding of the world whilst laying the foundations for future language learning. Our curriculum focuses on practical communication and is delivered in a fun and engaging way. In KS1, we do this through songs, games and storytelling. In KS2, we provide opportunities for the children to develop their ability to understand and respond to spoken and written language, speak with increasing confidence and fluency and write at varying length, for different purposes and audiences.

To enhance and enrich the teaching of French we are currently running an after-school French club for children in KS1. The club enables the children to build on their learning, develop their self-confidence and enhance their social and communication skills by interacting with children from other classes.

As well as this, our Year 6 children attended an event organised by Durham High School today to celebrate European Day of Languages. As part of the experience the children enjoyed visiting a 'French Market Place', buying items such as une gomme (a rubber), un stylo (a pen) and un crayon (a pencil). It was a fantastic opportunity to put skills learned in lessons into practice.

YEAR 6 PARENTS - Application for a Secondary School Place – September 2026

As you will be aware, your child is due to transfer to secondary school in September next year. **The application process will open on 1 September 2025**. You will need to read the School Admissions

online guidance for parents which is located on the School Admissions web page. This contains essential information that will help you in making your child's application. The guidance is available on our website www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions You must only complete one application and this must be to the Local Authority to which you pay your council tax (i.e. Home Local Authority).

If you live in County Durham, you need to complete an application to tell us which school you want your child to attend. You should list up to 3 school preferences and applying for just 1 school <u>Does</u> <u>Not</u> improve your chances of gaining a place at that school. You can apply for any school/academy in County Durham or in another Local Authority area.

Please apply on-line at www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions When you apply on-line you will receive an acknowledgement and you will receive an email on 2 March 2026 containing a link to obtain your offer of a school place from the Document Download Portal. Please save your log-in details.

Please note that school places are allocated according to specific criteria which are different depending upon which school you apply for your child to attend. **One criterion is "nearest school".** If you wish to know your nearest school, please contact us.

If your child's offer of a school place is for an oversubscribed school (i.e. where there are more applications for a school than places available) we will offer your child a school place based on the child's/parent's address. We may request information on the child's/parent's address when we offer a school place and the onus will be on you to prove your address if asked.

If you do not wish to apply on-line, you can contact the School Admissions Team by email or telephone to request a form. Email: schooladmissions@durham.gov.uk or telephone

03000 265 896. Your application must be received by us at the address below by the closing date. We strongly advise you to return the application form to us by "Royal Mail Signed for™" or "Royal Mail Special Delivery Guaranteed". If you complete a paper application form you will receive a letter to inform you of the school place offered to your child on the 2 March 2026.

Please note for both on-line applications and paper application forms, you will be required to read the disclaimer and sign/tick the box to agree that the information you provide on the application form is complete and correct otherwise the offer of a school place will be withdrawn.

The closing date for receipt for on-line/paper application forms is 31 October 2025.

- How do you help pupils understand that some things are worth working for even though they do not bring immediate results? How do we develop patience?
- What encourages and inspires you to persevere through difficult times in life?


